Title	Tour de Citizens
Theme	Citizenship
Objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To promote the idea of active citizenship among youngsters 2. To improve team work and organizational skills
Complexity (from 1 to 5)	3
Group size	30
Duration	45-60 min
Overview activity (step by Step)	<p>Youngsters will be divided into the 3 groups: blindfolds, active citizens and passive citizens. The task of the blindfolds is to find the bottles with questions and continue to the table with scissors where they will regain their sight by cutting the blindfolds. But to achieve that they will need a help of the active citizens. Active citizens should navigate the blindfolds by touching them in the following ways: 1. To make them move right they should touch their right shoulder, 2. To make them move left they should touch their left shoulder, 3. To make them move forward they should touch the back, and 4. To stop them they should touch the head. Active citizens are not allowed to speak to the blindfolds.</p> <p>Third group, passive citizens, will be placed in the middle of the room, sitting in chairs, positioned so that there are only two narrow passages through which the blindfold can reach the other side of the room where the bottle and the scissors are. Passive citizens will be divided in two groups, one to help and the other to distract the blindfolds on their way. They can not move, but they are allowed to speak to the blindfolds.</p> <p>Activity is completed when the blindfolds gather all the bottles and regain their sight by cutting the blindfolds.</p> <p>Debriefing will start by discussing the questions found in the bottles and introducing the idea of citizenship, active, passive citizens and illegal migrants.</p>
Materials needed	Blindfolds, bottles, papers, pencils.
Preparation before activity	Providing the venue, providing materials, discussing debriefing questions.

Instructions	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Division of students into the 3 groups: blindfolds, active citizens and passive citizens 2. Explanation of tasks to each group 3. Putting blindfolds to the participants of the first group 4. Setting up the chairs for passive citizens 5. Distributing the bottles with questions around the venue 6. Start of the game 7. Debriefing
Debriefing and evaluation	<p>Debriefing will be based on questions found in the bottles. Some of these questions are:</p> <p>How did each of the group feel during the game? What happened during the game? Who would you like to be in this game? Why? Have you heard about the migrants? Citizens? Who would migrants be in this game? Active citizens?</p> <p>Find additional questions if you wish to involve more bottles or questions.</p>
Tips for facilitators	<p>Make sure that there is no tough physical contact (active citizens pushing the blindfolds, passive citizens physically preventing the blindfolds...)</p>
Suggestions for follow up	<p>Decoration of classrooms.</p>
Ideas for action	<p>To organize the Tour de Citizen class with youngsters of other schools.</p>
